

Meggison's Camp

The meeting was called to order at 10:25 by Vice President Charles Saurman in the absence of Pres. Louise Novak. New members, Heidi Fischer and Joyce Leach were introduced and welcomed to the group. They are the new owners of the John and Mary Penney cottage.

The secretary's and treasurer's reports were read and approved. There is a balance of \$339.13 in the Treasury and \$106.16 in the Road Fund.

Old Business: The road sign was discussed. Flo Whiting brought the top sign board on which she had painted a beautiful scene of loons and pines. A round of applause was given in appreciation of her excellent painting. Members are to bring their name signs to Ralph Morse and he and Walter Novak will erect the sign and hang the individual signs on hooks. Ralph Morse volunteered to dismantle it in the fall to prevent possible damage during the winter months. It was suggested the signs be hung high enough to allow for new residents, and Judy Comer will get more applications for future members.

New Business: Nominating committee volunteers for the slate of new officers are May Hazen, Moe Rousseau and Ralph Morse and Ava Saurman.

It was voted and approved that the annual picnic be held on July 12 at 1:00 p.m. at the Morse cottage. We were reminded to bring tables. A discussion followed concerning the menu. May Hazen reminded us that the purpose of the organization originally was to have enough funds available to hire an attorney if a problem should arise. Victor Zelman facetiously remarked that we should have good lobsters, not good lawyers. It was agreed that those desiring lobsters would pay \$5.00 for each lobster. If the price of lobsters is less than that amount, the excess collected will be given to the Treasury. If over \$5.00 it would be taken from the \$150 allowance for the picnic. Hot dogs and hamburgers will be paid for from this allowance along with paper supplies. Those desiring steak will bring their own. Charlie Saurman offered to cook and John Fields volunteered to assist. Flo Whiting volunteered to chair a feed committee: Ava Saurman, Marion Brown, & Jeannette Ward. Flo will collect money for lobsters on July 4th weekend and turn it over to the Treas-

urer, and after the meeting she will pass a list for food to be donated by each family attending. A motion was made by Bob Hazen and seconded by Ralph Morse that \$150.00 would be donated from the Association Treasury for the picnic. The motion was approved. Also it was agreed the cost for each guest who wishes to have lobster would be \$5.00.

A discussion followed about the group living in old vehicles on Notch Road. Victor Zelman stated that the owner, Don Nielson, was deceased, and he felt his four daughters would support any action we take on this matter. It was also mentioned these inhabitants may be moving June 1st, but not necessarily their refuse. Flo Whiting made a motion that the Association as a group attend the Selectman's meeting in August, amended to state that as many as possible attend the next Selectman's meeting. Jo Smith seconded the motion and it was voted in the affirmative. Victor will inquire as to when and where the next meeting will be held.

It was suggested we welcome new residents to join our organization and invite them to the picnic.

A register was passed around to up-date membership addresses and telephone numbers.

The fall meeting will be held at Flo Whiting and Jo Smith's cottage on August 31.

A motion was made by Moe Rousseau and seconded by Ralph Morse to adjourn the meeting. Meeting adjourned 11:50.
